This guideline makes recommendations on best practice in the use of peri-operative prophylactic antibiotics to prevent surgical site infections (SSI). SSI is a major cause of healthcare acquired infection. With the shortage of new antibiotics and the increasing problem of multidrug resistance there is an ever increasing need to restrict the use of antibiotic prophylaxis to those operations where it is most likely to be of benefit and also to limit the duration of prophylaxis, usually to a single dose. Other areas of concern such as antibiotic allergy, cost effectiveness and meticillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) are considered. Appropriate antibiotic prophylaxis for specific operations is detailed. The use of specific antibiotics is not generally discussed as appropriateness will depend on local factors such as availability, resistance and policy.
