The Mental Status Examination: Key Terms and Resources ...

Overview. A mental status examination, just like a physical examination, is an intrusion on the patient ' s rights and should not be conducted against the patient ' s will. Before a physician performs a mental status examination, s/he must explain the procedure to the patient and ensure the patient understands that exam results will be documented.

MENTAL STATUS EXAM. The Mental Status Exam (MSE) is an assessment of

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the individual ' s current state of mind. It assesses the range, quality, and depth of perception, thought processes, feelings, and psychomotor actions. Direct observation of the individual is required for the completion of the MSE. The observation occurs before, during and after the formal clinical interview while the clinician is in direct view of the individual.

The Mental Status Exam is a “ snapshot ” of a patient, that describes their behaviours and thoughts at the time you interviewed them. Think about how a psychotic individual's MSE might change over the course of a few hours, or how a manic patient might similarly fluctuate.

The Mental Status Exam is analogous to the physical exam: it is a series of observations and examinations at one point in time. Focused questions and observations can reveal "normal" or pathological findings. Although our observations occur in the context of an interview and may therefore be ordered differently for each patient, the report of our findings is ordered and "paints a picture" of a patient's appearance, thinking, emotion and

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cognition.

A mental status examination can be an abbreviated assessment done because someone appears to be in obvious need of hospitalization, or it can be an elongated process that takes place over several interviews. The MSE always has the same content, and you write your observations in roughly the same order each time.

A Mental State Examination (MSE) is a part of every mental health assessment. Interpretation of the MSE must keep in mind the patient's age and developmental level. If there is

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any indication of current suicidal or homicidal ideation in the child or adolescent they must be referred for further assessment by a mental health clinician.
